I have worked in various job roles within the acquired brain injury field from: Support Worker, Team Leader, Deputy Manager to CQC registered Service Manager and hold a current Social Worker registration with Social Work England.

For the past 13 years I have worked as a Service Manager of a specialist Acquired Brain Injury Residential Rehabilitation Service promoting and managing: Multi-Disciplinary Team led residential rehabilitation, monitoring goals & interventions whilst working towards discharge planning.

I have established positive working relationships with employees, service users, their families, external providers, professionals, and funders. By working collaboratively with other professionals, I have gained experience in setting up innovative and person-centred community-based care packages, including recruiting and managing care teams to enable people to live in their own homes with support.

I have a keen focus upon person centred care and outcome measures, excellent written and oral communication skills and strength of character which enables me to remain calm whilst working in often challenging and fast paced situations.
